

Infrastructure Security Awareness

The Infrastructure Security Awareness (ISA) program was created in September 2004 to share vital, For Official Use Only (FOUO) information and ensure timely dissemination of critical infrastructure protection guidance and intelligence with private sector professionals who have a need to know.

The ISA program is an information exchange and communications platform among private sector professionals sharing homeland security awareness, prevention, response, mitigation, and recovery information facilitated by the Statewide Terrorism & Intelligence Center, the designated state of Illinois fusion center.

The ISA program provides multiple venues that members can obtain information from. These include:

- Daily briefs and situation reports
- Intelligence notes
- Access to the Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN)
- Monthly intelligence webinar
- Contact with a dedicated private sector/critical infrastructure specialist
- Annual partners meeting to strategize and exchange ideas
- 24/7/365 center availability
- Share strategic and tactical information to include information requests, suspicious activity reporting, threat assessments, and trend analysis.



What is a Fusion Center?

A center established by state and local governments designed to integrate the collection, analysis, and dissemination of law enforcement, public safety, and terrorism information.
